We will then build on this by adding analytical skills to their learning, with a focus on language and structure. We will also begin to compare texts. KS2/3 Assessment: Students will be assessed with a comprehension test about an extract from a story. -Baseline assessment: week of 27th September -Final assessment: week of 18th October</p>	<p>Introduction to Shakespeare Students will re cap the conventions of a play text and also look at how character is developed. This will be explored through drama and through group discussion. Students will also use this text as a springboard for some creative writing. KS2/3 Assessment: Students will be assessed through a a comprehension test about an extract from a story where they will also present a piece of creative writing. -Assessment week of 6th of December</p>	<p>Poetry in Context Students should have an understanding of the main conventions of poetry and then some of the different historical periods, their most famous poets and the themes that arose from these contexts. KS2/3 Assessment: Students will be assessed with a literature based question of two poems, where they will make comparisons between the content and techniques used. -Assessment week of 7th of February</p>	<p>Fairy Tales Writing Students will understand how to be inspired by famous tales and how to create their own. There will be a focus on the drafting process in writing and using a range of descriptive writing methods. KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed by a piece of creative non-fiction writing, such as a letter, speech, leaflet or article. -Assessment week of 14th of March</p>	<p>Assessment Preparation Students will be prepared for their assessment. The focus will be on reading comprehension and creative writing. Students will understand the layout of their upcoming assessment and know how to approach each of the questions. KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed by an end of year exam that tests their comprehension skills with an extract. They will need to discuss the writer’s use of language and structure. -Assessment week of 20th of June</p>	<p>Spoken Language Unit Students will complete an end of year exam in this time. After this, the focus will then be on speaking and active listening. In groups, students will select topics that they are interested in and use this for stimulus for creating their own podcast episode.. KS2/3 Assessment: Students will complete a podcast, which they will record where they will need to use standard English and choose an interesting topic. -Assessment week of 4th of July</p>

Students will also be reading high quality English literature. It is also a GCSE text. KS3/4 Assessment: Students will be assessed with a literature based question where they will analyse an extract from the text. -Assessment week of 18th of October</p>	<p>Romeo and Juliet - Shakespeare Students should understand increasingly challenging texts, learn new vocabulary, new historical contexts and make links to more contemporary ideas and literature. KS3/4 Assessment: Students will be assessed through a piece of creative writing. -Assessment week of 13th of December</p>	<p>Descriptive writing Students will continue to develop their understanding of descriptive writing by using images to plan and develop a piece of creative writing. They will understand the differences between narrative storytelling and descriptive writing KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed by a piece of creative writing based on a picture of a scene. -Assessment week of 10th of January</p>	<p>Diversity & Inclusion poetry Students will develop their knowledge of poetry, poetic conventions and themes, focusing on Diversity & Inclusion in poetry.. A variety of poets and themes will be studied. KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed with a comprehension test about an extract from a story. -Assessment week of 14th of March</p>	<p>Assessment Preparation Students will be prepared for their assessment. KS3/4 Assessment: Students will be assessed with a comprehension test of two texts, where they will make comparisons between the way they write. -Assessment week of 6th of December</p>	<p>Dystopian Creative Writing Students will understand how to write using images as stimulus and how to plan effectively. There will be a focus on the drafting process in writing and using a range of descriptive writing methods. KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed through a piece of creative writing. -Assessment week of 10th of January</p>	<p>War Poems Students will study the 6 of the GCSE Power and Conflict anthology poetry. 10	<p>AQA GCSE The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde - R.L Stevenson Students will understand the plot and characters in the text. They will have a good understanding of the context of Victorian England. Students will also look at Language Paper 1, section A skills. KS4 - AQA EngLit P1/ EngLang P1 Assessment: Students will be assessed using an English Language Paper 1 (section A). They will also be writing Literature Paper 1 essays (Section B) -Assessment week of 18th of October</p>	<p>AQA GCSE Macbeth - Shakespeare Students study the plot, characters and major themes in Shakespeare’s Macbeth. Students will study each act in turn and make sure that they understand the language and ideas and have a good grasp of Shakespeare’s language and ideas. Students will also work on their creative writing skills for English Language Paper 1, section B. KS4 - EngLit P1/ EngLang P1 Assessment: Students will be assessed using an English Language Paper 1, section B (creative writing). They will also be writing Literature Paper 1 essays (section A) -Assessment week of 21st of February</p>		<p>AQA GCSE Power and Conflict Poems Here students will study the remaining 9 Love and Relationships poems. All poems will be well annotated in the students’ anthology with lots of ideas around all of them. Students will also work on their English Language Paper 2, section A skills. KS4 - EngLit P2/ EngLang P2 Assessment: Students will be assessed using an English Language Paper 2, section A. They will also be writing Literature Paper 2, section B essays. Students will also have their mocks during this period. -Assessment week of 27th of June</p>		<p>Spoken Language Unit Students will complete a mock exam in this time. After this, the focus will then be on speaking and active listening. Students complete their final spoken language piece and it is filmed. Students will also work on their English Language Paper 2 skills. KS4 Spoken Language and EngLang P2 Assessment: Students will be recorded completing their real GCSE Spoken Language exams.
