They will respond to texts in a range of forms.</p> <p>Students will continue to develop their understanding of descriptive writing by using images to plan and develop a piece of creative writing.</p> <p>KS3 Assessment: Students will be assessed by a piece of creative writing based on a picture of a scene.</p>	<p>Shakespeare: Villains in Shakespeare Students should understand increasingly challenging texts, learn new vocabulary, new historical contexts and make links to more contemporary ideas and literature.</p> <p>Students will explore characters and themes in Shakespeare, responding to texts in a range of forms.
