What do the grades mean?

Target Grade is the aspirational grade that Joe is capable of achieving at the end of Year 7 based on prior attainment.

Current Grade is Joe's overall teacher assessment at present.

The grades given on the report equate to the GCSE grades ranging from 1 to 9 (1 being the lowest). Each grade is subdivided into '+', '=' or '-' to indicate progress through a grade – '1+' is, for example, a higher grade than a '1='. Tr6 means the student is working towards a grade 1.

2+: Top of the grade boundary 2=: Middle of the grade boundary 2-: Lower end of grade boundary
