3 x tutor sessions per week are focussed intervention

October data collection

- Tests are happening over the next week or have happened already
- Data will be collated by subjects to ensure year 11 are on track to meet targets at this stage in year 11.
- You will receive a report in the last week of this half term. Blue - overachieving, Green - on target, Amber - slightly underachieving, red - significantly underachieving
- Pre-Mock exams intervention will start in November based on the data generated in October



November/December Mock Exams

- Theatre will become an exam room. SEND students may be in separate room to allow for access arrangements
- Full exam papers where appropriate. Timetable to follow.

Start week beg 20th nov - all subjects assessed

Following the exams:



- Detailed feedback on areas that they need to focus on
- Continued support with focused revision
- Second Mock Exams **February/March** to cover course content not examined in November/December or re-test content less well understood



What happens after mock exams?

- *January Results Day - Friday 19th* - We will have an assembly where students will receive an envelope with their results from the mock exams (designed to replicate what will happen in Summer)
- Rewards for top performers - most progress and highest grades
- *Parents evening - Thursday 25th January 2024* - To discuss mock exams and what next steps need to be taken to support progress.
- Students will receive a breakdown of topics for each subject based on the mock exams. This is question by question in every subject
- Helpful to guiding independent revision
- Helpful for staff choosing students for period 7 intervention groups.

Attendance Ladder

How close is your child to 100%?


0 days off school	100%	Perfection
Equates to 2 days off school each year	99%	Excellent
Equates to 5 days off school each year	97%	Good
Equates to 10 days off school each year	95%	Slight Concern
Equates to 20 days off school each year	90%	Concerned
Equates to 30 days off school each year	85%	Very Concerned

Some facts and figures on Attendance

- 90% attendance equals **half a day** of school missed **every week**
- One school year at 90% attendance = **4 whole weeks** of lessons and school work missed
- 90% attendance over 5 years of secondary school = **half a school year missed**
- There is a direct correlation between low student attendance and future employment prospects

Research suggests that 17 missed school days a year is equal to a GCSE grade drop in achievement (Department for Education and Skills).

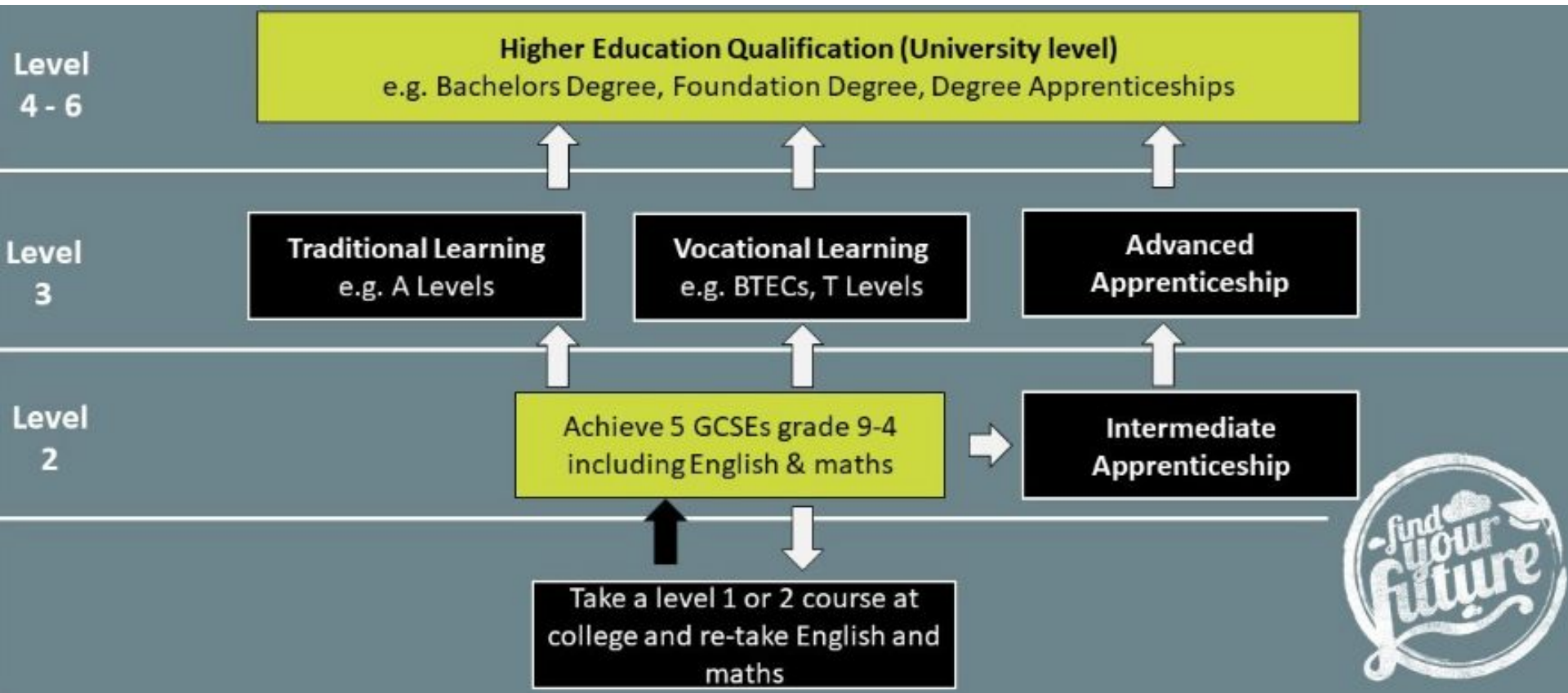
Attendance	Average progress 8 score

Destinations after Year 11



GCSE = Level 2

Students need five grade 4s to progress onto Level 3 for most institutions

What happens if my child doesn't pass English or maths

- To pass English and maths students need at least a grade 4
- Without these grades students will have to resit these at their post 16 institution
- This is often a significant challenge as teaching time goes down (students in year 11 have 5 hours a week of teaching, compared to year 12/13 students who have 1 hour)
- It will be difficult for your child to access level 3 qualifications without 5 GCSEs inc E and M
- Many jobs require you to have passed English and maths

Pathways post Year 11

Options at Level 3 (Next academic year)

- A levels - assessed mainly by exam at the end of the 2 year course
- BTECs - assessed mainly by coursework, with some exams. The assessment is spread out across the 2 years
- Apprenticeship - Earn a (small) wage, whilst you learn. E.g. 4 days a week in College, 1 day at work.
- T Levels - 3 A level equivalent, with a significant amount of work experience

Last year's Yr 11 destinations were Chessington School, Esher College, Kingston College, NESCOL & Tolworth Girls School.
